STIRRING battle music from the film *King Arthur* powered Andrew Gould and Ultra Jazz to win the advanced medium freestyle.

"Dramatic music suits him as he's a big horse," said Andrew. "It was the first time we've used the music. There are a few little adjustments I want to make to it before the finals. He's just started at advanced medium so we

thought we'd have a crack at the music."

Andrew's pupil Emily Stanford won the novice freestyle at her first attempt on Korenbloem Vincit Omnia, achieving the highest score of the day with 80.28%.

"Emily bought him from us last year and keeps him in training with us," said Andrew. "He's a very talented six-year-old by Negro and a great horse for her."

UAlteaus HFD, won the novice qualifier on 75% for Ruth Lovell. Ruth trains with former employer Lucy Oppe.

"Alteaus is the first

dressage horse I've had," said Ruth. "He's seven and has come on slowly and still needs more time and mileage to relax."

Jacky Stolper won the elementary music with Steph Ilsley's Rubinia and the medium freestyle with Bridget McCarthy's Winston Jani, using the same jazz music for both.

"Rubinia is a jolly nice mare," said Jacky. "She's a state premium Hanoverian and will probably go to stud next year. Winston did some really expressive trot work and got all eights for his artistic marks."

"She was a bit tense in the medium but felt better in the advanced medium, although we made a few green mistakes," said the 18-year-old rider. "She's really genuine and fun. You have to play with her or she gets bored. She's learnt so much in a few months."
