

1 SADDLES

All my leather work is by Italian company Prestige. It's really good quality and looks great. The style I use is the Optimax – it has a lovely deep seat and it is made from soft calfskin leather. The stirrups are again from Prestige. They're made from magnesium, the treads are interchangeable, and you have the choice of a light or heavy metal tread. www.prestigeitaly.com

2 BRIDLES

My bridles feature Prestige's new headpiece design. It's padded and shaped so it sits around the horse's ears. This style is designed to keep the horse more comfortable. The double bridles I have with me this weekend have rolled leather cheekpieces, which look really good on the horses. I have no preference on what make of bit I use. I have a huge number of different bits at home and will use whatever suits each individual horse.

3 TACK LOCKER

This is a great addition to my lorry. It can carry three saddles, has a pull-out rack for my bridles, and additional storage for boots and other equipment. Because it's on wheels it saves a lot of lifting and carrying.

4 BOOTS

I use a lot of different products from Woof Wear. They have a very good range of boots that give protection and comfort for the horse. These new leg wraps in the picture are great. They're designed to use under stable bandages, they offer good protection and I particularly like using them when I'm staying away from home and the horses are in strange stables, just in case they knock themselves. www.woofwear.co.uk

5 FEEDING

I feed Baileys Horse Feeds to all of my horses. The range of feeds is extensive but I tend to choose a feed from the Everyday range for my horses, who are good-doers. Those who need a little more energy and sparkle are fed Racehorse Cubes. www.baileyshorsefeeds.co.uk

NUPAFEED

This supplement is great at keeping horses calm. I feed it to Varisto before travelling. I've found Nupafeed is great at keeping him a little more relaxed about going on the lorry. www.nupafeed.co.uk
